#### **ACTIVITIES**

We can consider funding only one activity at a time per child. The only exception to this guideline is swimming lessons.

Restricted to unlicensed caregivers and three years old and younger dependents of youth in foster care

- THEME PARK ADMISSION (IN ARIZONA)
- WEIGHTED BLANKET/VEST
   Child must be no less
   than 1 year old and
   blanket or vest must not
   weigh more than 10% of
   the child's body weight.

## **HOW IT WORKS**

The eligibility requirement for a request from the Arizona Friends of Foster Children Foundation is that the child is a currently adjudicated dependent ward of the court in Arizona or tribal court of Arizona.

#### COMPLETE AN APPLICATION



To receive funding, all requests must go through AFFCF's application and approval process. Anyone can submit an application on behalf of a child in foster care. Use the QR code to the left or visit

**affcf.org/apply** to access our online application. Our application asks for contact information for the child's DCS or Tribal case manager, as we must verify the child's current status as a ward of the court in foster care in Arizona.

#### ATTACH SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

Required documentation is specified for each category. The documentation must display exactly what is being requested and the exact cost of the request.

#### WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

- From the time you submit an application to the time it is approved takes about 7 to 10 business days.
- Check payments are made payable to the vendor/ service provider and are mailed to the caregiver address on the application.
- For reimbursement items, AFFCF notifies the applicant via email that the application has been approved and provides directions on how to receive reimbursement.

Please remember that AFFCF cannot reimburse any purchases made prior to receiving approval from AFFCF.



The AFFCF Keys to Success program offers one-on-one career development and employment development services tailored to fit the unique needs of each youth we serve

#### **Keys to Success services include:**

- Career exploration and planning
- Work readiness training and job search assistance
- Development of education plans and assistance to attain goals
- Life skills training
- Financial literacy education
- Connections to resources that will eliminate barriers to career and life success

#### POST-SECONDARY SCHOLARSHIPS

AFFCF's Post-Secondary Scholarship program funds tuition and fees for young people who age out of foster care or tribal foster care in Arizona and wish to attend a university or community college.

University applicants are eligible to receive scholarships up to \$5,000/academic year (\$2,500 per semester). Community college applicants are eligible to receive scholarships up to \$2,000/academic year (\$1,000 per semester). To be eligible, applicants must:

- Be ages 17 24.
- Have reached (or will reach age 18 as a ward of the state of Arizona.
- Be enrolled (or will enroll) in at least six college credit hours for the upcoming semester.
